

Crashes Are No Accident

6,420,000 auto accidents in the United States in a year. 98% of crashes are caused by human error. Every 5 seconds a car crash occurs.



The cost?

\$230 Billion dollars annually in the U.S.

The average company pays \$740 for every employee each year in off-the job injuries including coast associated with absenteeism, health care and productivity and unscheduled work interruptions.

Top Six Human Driver Errors

- 1. Failure to wear a seatbelt
- a. Every hour someone dies in the U.S. because they were not wearing a seatbelt.
- b. Seat belts save lives... ~15,000 a year.
- 2. Excessive speeding
 - a. When speed increases from 40 mph to 60 mph, the energy released in a crash more than doubles
- 3. Distraction/inattentiveness eating, drinking, smoking, radio, cell phone.
 - a. Drowsy drivers account for about 100,000 accidents every year in the United States
- 4. Incorrect assumptions about other drivers
- 5. Tailgating/not leaving enough space between vehicles
- 6. Not checking traffic before pulling out or crossing lanes
